All data come from the Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU) website (<http://www.shanghairanking.com>). This ranking is created by the Center for World Class Universities, which is located at Shanghai Jiao Tong University in China. Universities do not complete a survey for ARWU; the Center obtains all data from open or third party sources. The Center has started to survey universities for the Global Research University Profiles (GRUP). Texas A&M University first participated in the 2013 GRUP survey.

ARWU uses six objective indicators to rank world universities, including the number of alumni and staff winning Nobel Prizes and Fields Medals, number of highly cited researchers selected by Thomson Scientific, number of articles published in journals of Nature and Science, number of articles indexed in Science Citation Index - Expanded and Social Sciences Citation Index, and per capita performance with respect to the size of an institution.
